

#### **Good News!**

For all of us, at one time or another, life seems to run out of wine. We look at our relationships and find ourselves saying, "There's no more wine." It may be a friendship of five years or a marriage of twenty-five years, but, for some, the wine runs out. For others, it is the job that loses its challenge. Or, one day, the foreman gathers everyone to announce that the plant is closing. In a moment, all has turned into vinegar; there is no more wine. For others still, it is when retirement suffocates the future, choking all that once gave meaning.

However, there are also those times when hope is reborn, when we feel "espoused" not only by life but also by God, when the ordinary turns extraordinary—and the water becomes wine. It is the phone call offering a new job after we have collected unemployment checks for months. It is falling in love when we have given up on the notion. It is conceiving a child after years of barren waiting. It is someone who listens, finally, when no one else would. It is at times like these—and many others as well—when we are caught off-balance and trip into God unwittingly, saved from drudgery and redeemed to live a life enriched, when water is turned into wine. It is a deeply felt joy that reveals God's presence.

#### St. John the Baptist Parish Council Meeting – December 4, 2024 @ 7:00 PM

The Parish Council met in the Senior Center. Father Gaydosik opened with a prayer.

#### **Attendees:**

#### Review Mass attendance/needs of the Parish:

Father reviewed the counts from October for all 3 Masses from 2020 – 2024:

The question of whether our Mass times are meeting the parishioners was raised, as well as a comment that more servers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, and music/choir members are needed. It was decided that music at the 7:30 AM Mass should continue. Father asked if there was interest in adding another Eucharistic Adoration in addition to the one held on the First Friday of the month.

#### Bingo:

Each Parish that feeds into St. John Central Grade School is responsible for sending an assessment/financially contributing to the school each year. Out of the 47 students currently attending the school, approximately 33 of them are from our Parish. Each year, we contribute \$102,000/year (\$8,500/month) to the school, largely funded by the profits made from Bingo.

As of January 1, 2025, we will no longer hold a Bingo fundraiser. Some of the factors contributing to this decision were that no one has currently volunteered to lead Bingo, increase of cost (supplies/rent), lack of volunteers and volunteer burnout, as well as decrease in Bingo players.

The question raised is how we will continue to maintain our financial contribution to the school without having Bingo. Father mentioned that he was made aware of an investment account opened by Msgr. Highland that has approximately \$10,000 in it that he is trying to secure on behalf of the Parish. Approximately \$32,787.00 was returned from the DPSC contributions this year.

#### **Building/Grounds Updates:**

*Property* - The Parish purchased 10 acres of land that includes the major center of the parking lot. There are 2 smaller sections that we are looking to secure. The parking lot will need sealed in Spring 2025.

Lighting - At a previous meeting, adding a dusk to dawn light on the cemetery side of the church was discussed.

Building – The front doors of the church are rusting and at times, won't latch. Discussed potentially making the doors to the church shorter and adding a skylight above them to add more light in the vestibule.

Sidewalks – The concrete leading to the front door of the church needs repaired due to it being a tripping hazard. It was also discussed that the large step on the right of the church door should be corrected, however this could require the church bell/sign to be raised/relocated. Discussed making an alternate handicap entrance in case of emergencies if the front door is blocked/inaccessible.

*Church sign* – Discussed relocating the church sign and possible replacing with a digital sign that is more easily visible from the road. Consider discussing with Discount Signs & Awning.

Gas well – The gas well in front of the school is declining.

#### **Evangelization/Activities:**

We will be looking into updating the Church Directory this year.

Father mentioned hosting an appreciation dinner for those in our Church who are servers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, choir/music members.

Holding a dinner or event for the graduates of our Parish after Mass was also discussed.
