#### **Good News!**

Adolescence can bring family life into an upheaval for both parents and adolescents alike. At its heart, adolescence is an urge for independence, a silent instinct to be part of the larger world. It is a calling sewn by God's Spirit into the very fabric of being human. At its best, family life can be the staging ground for that movement outward.

Hannah recognized this when she believed that her young son Samuel was chosen for a specific role in life. It moved her to bring Samuel to the temple to be raised there in growing service to the community. Ultimately Samuel became a charismatic leader of the Hebrew people who would anoint both Saul and David as king. That same calling seemed to take time to unfold in the awareness of Joseph and Mary who wondered why Jesus stayed behind in the temple. "Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" asked Jesus of them (Luke 2:49). All of us are meant to live more than a life of satisfaction for ourselves or even the fulfillment of our parents' dreams.

We may find ourselves asking a young person what they want to be when they grow up. A more valuable question might be what they think God wants them to be. While the Spirit of God does not usually ask us to be something contrary to our inclinations, the call of service to the needs of the human family is an added piece to the puzzle of what someone's life might look like.

#### Puts Prayer at the Forefront of Catholic Life

Bishop Edward Malesic of the Diocese of Cleveland, Ohio released the pastoral letter 'A Flourishing Apostolic Church' on Dec. 15,2024. Drawing on prayer and reflection as key elements in the spiritual renewal of his Catholic flock. Bishop Malesic said his intent is "that we might recommit ourselves to a daily entry into the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ so that the Church may truly flourish." Bishop Malesic is asking all Catholics, whether practicing or lapsed, to set aside 15 minutes each day for simple reflection. While daily prayer is quite basic to all baptized Catholics, it can be easily overlooked in a society prioritizing "getting on with things" over quiet moments of introspection.

"For many of us involved in parish life, implementing a program, publishing a policy, or promulgating a pastoral plan seems like a better use of our time and energy than deepening our friendship with God. Outside of parish life, the secular workday, school schedules, and the challenges of raising a family can be allencompassing, leaving us feeling pressed for time. ... As a bishop, I am convinced that none of those things will matter or be effective if we are not serious about deepening our friendship with God," Bishop Malesic writes in the pastoral letter. "I invite you, if it is not already part of your daily routine, to make time for God — at least fifteen minutes of prayer a day. Consider putting down your phone and rest in the Lord. Read some Scripture. Give thanks for the blessings you have received. Review your day with him. Share your dreams and your joys. Share your fears, sorrows, and worries. Then listen for his response, which will usually be heard in the silence of your heart as Jesus speaks to
