

Good News!

When personal worlds collapse, we can lose our way. The stars that marked our path through life disappear. When everything in life on which we had depended is shaken, we can feel life is not worth living. It happens when someone we love dies, when life-threatening illness lays us low, when a relationship disintegrates without warning. Then the world we once knew is no more. This week's Gospel suggests "when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates" (Mark 13:29). But how can that be?

I met Marguerite and Ken when I came to the parish. A short time later, I received a phone call that Ken had suffered a massive heart attack. He had gone down to the basement for something, and that was where he died. I spent some time with Marguerite, and as you can imagine, she was wrapped in grief. They'd had a wonderful marriage, she told me, had done everything together. Whatever one did, the other went along. Two years later, Marguerite and I were talking and she began telling me how life had changed for her without Ken. She still missed him terribly. But lately she found herself involved in all sorts of parish activities and services she never would have gotten into, simply because they had always done things together. Without Ken, she found new worlds she never knew existed. For Marguerite, God had opened the gates to new life. •

cause we have to count and record each collection separately, we have to split up the checks by making change from cash donations, which takes extra time and creates opportunities for mistakes.

Catholic Charities of Southeastern Ohio announced the launch of a new counseling service aimed at providing compassionate, faith-informed mental health support to the community, with a special focus on reaching the underserved and impoverished. This new venture will focus on treating anxiety, grief, trauma, depression, and offer couples therapy to individuals and families within the Diocese of Steubenville. Recognizing the growing need for mental health services, especially among the poor and vulnerable populations, Catholic Charities is partnering with Wellspring Counseling Services to deliver highquality, professional care rooted in Christian values. This service is designed to address the emotional and psychological well-being of the entire community, with an emphasis on providing care to those who may not otherwise have access to mental health support. "This is a significant step for Catholic Charities as we expand our mission to include mental health care," said Leah Perdue, social services coordinator. "We recognize that underserved communities, particularly those struggling with poverty, often face the greatest barriers to receiving care. Our goal is to remove those barriers and ensure that every person, regardless of their financial situation, has access to the support they need for healing and hope." Perdue said, "Initially, the new counseling service will be available at our Steubenville office (located at the Sacred Heart Center of Hope, 430 Slack St.), serving residents of the Diocese of Steubenville. As the program develops, we plan to expand our outreach by offering telehealth counseling services to reach other parts of the diocese, especially rural and underserved areas, ensuring that individuals without transportation or in remote locations can still access this critical care."
